

Life-saving rules

I plan and lead:

- I am confident that I have put together a team that has the right skills, training and experience
- · I have carried out a risk assessment and ensured that all of those involved are informed and have understood
- I have made sure that the rig plan has been risk assessed to ensure a safe work site
- I have made sure that personnel are confident in relation to the job and have understood their duties
- I have ensured that the team has had sufficient time for planning, risk assessment and safe job analysis (SJA)
- I have ensured that the team has the correct and approved equipment for the tasks to be carried out • I have ensured that high visibility clothing class 2* is worn on the upper body

I participate in, and carry out:

- I have understood the tasks to be carried out and how I perform them in a safe manner
- I use mandatory safety equipment, relevant to the hazards involved
- I wear high visibility clothing class 2* on my upper body
- I speak up and and take necessary actions when I see there is a risk of dangerous situations • I am alert, pay attention and only use a mobile telephone in designated safe zones

Conflicts personnel and construction vehicles

- Lifesaver for leader: I always ensure that personnel
- are made aware of the construction vehicles blind
- I ensure safe walkways at the construction site
- I have given a mandatory order to use a helper when reversing, where there is a danger of a collision between personnel and construction vehicles

Lifesaver for personnel:

- I always stop 10 metres from construction vehicles and wait for eye contact and a clear signal from the driver/operator before I enter its working area
- I am, and have made my colleagues aware of the construction vehicles blind
- I always use a helper when reversing where there is a risk



Fall from height

Lifesaver for leader:

- I always make sure that my team has assessed and - as far as possible – given priority to physical barriers to prevent falls before fall arrest solutions
- I have arranged the job so that my team has had sufficient time for planning, risk assessment and SJA

Falling objects

Lifesaver for leader:

- I always ensure that the work site is kept tidy
- I give crane operators support and the authority to stop

dangerous lifting operations

- Lifesaver for personnel:
- I never leave loose objects lying around I always place myself in
- a safe zone and never walk underneath a suspended load
- I never remove or breach guards or barriers I stop all lifting operations that
- are unsafe I always secure loads before



Contact with live electricity

- Lifesaver for leader:
- I never commence a job without an overview of all risk
- factors related to electricity I inform all personnel of risk
- elements related to electricity I maintain a tidy workplace I have routines for inspection
- and maintenance of electrical equipment
- Lifesaver for personnel: I always obtain an overview of
- the risks involved • I do not repair electrical equipment myself – I notify an electrician if I find faults and
- defects I keep my workplace tidy and hang up cables properly I am familiar with relevant safety rules and never breach

Construction failure

Lifesaver for leader:

- I have quality-assured plans for assembly
- There must be no personnel present on the two floors below the assembly area

Explosion

<u>Gas</u>

Lifesaver for leader: I ensure that oxygen and other flammable gases are stored

- separately, a minimum of 5 metres apart I ensure that we store no
- more gas than required for production I have stipulated that odour

connections/fittings for faults

additives must be added to oxygen

- Lifesaver for personnel:
- I always close the valve on the I maintain good order and gas bottle after use

and wear before use

I always make sure that gas bottles are stored upright in a well-ventilated place, secured

against tipping – never indoors

Explosives

Lifesaver for leader:

- I am aware of my responsibility for blasting works according to the Regulations on Handling of Explosive Substances
- I have requested a risk assessment and blasting plan
- from the blasting contractor I demand that work is stopped and a new risk assessment carried out when changes arise

Lifesaver for personnel:

- I always control the hoses and I carry out blasting work according to established plans and stop when changes arise
 - tidiness on the work site when charging explosives
 - I always make sure that the blaster has controlled that no explosives remains
